




SPACE		DESCRIPTION AND COST TO NAME
Youth Center		This expansive new space incorporates the heart of the expanded Bogle Family Children’s Library, storytime space, craft room, reading nooks, wellness room and study rooms with adjacency to the new larger Walmart Room. Provides a reimagined Teen Zone with teen study rooms, small group study space to facilitate interaction and collaboration for students. A leadership principal donation of \$2,000,000 would name the Youth Center.
Community Hub		Adjacent to both the café and the Friends bookstore, the hub will serve as a gathering space for patrons and the community. It will feature displays about Bentonville, cultural events and information related to social services. A donation of \$1,000,000 can name this high profile 1,220 sq ft area.
Public Veranda		An extension of the existing veranda, this outdoor space will be a high-use area that provides for leisure or scheduled activities and connecting with others. A donation of \$1,000,000 would name this space.
Makerspace		Centralized, versatile and high-profile 1,145 sq ft room for hands-on learning for all ages and interests. Making, tinkering, arts and crafts, plus more will happen in BPL's makerspace. Visibility from Main Street creates a living billboard for library activities. A \$500,000 donation would name this space.
Library Marketplace		This spacious 4,230 sq ft area leads patrons through the library. It will serve as a space to feature popular collections, specialty displays with the ability to be converted for programmatic use such as expo events, festival booths, and book sales. This space is available to be named with a donation of \$500,000.
Children's Storytime Space	 NAMED - Cathy & Denton Seilhan	A dedicated 995 sq ft space for early literacy storytimes to serve growing families. The primary target audience is babies through preschool, with options for programs with older children or open for passive learning activities. This 995 sq ft area has been named for Cathy and Denton Seilhan recognizing their generous \$500,000 donation.
Literacy Area	NAMED - McGaugh Family	The existing sunroom will be enclosed with glass to offer a quiet place for readers to enjoy a good book or group meetings. Featured specialty collections are shelved in this area. This 725 sq ft area has been named recognizing the McGaugh Family's generous \$250,000 donation.
Children's Craft area		Adjacent to the storytime space, the 900 sq ft craft area will provide a special room for children’s art and STEM learning, as well as writing workshops and other programs for children ranging from preschool to 6th grade. A donation of \$250,000 would name this area.
Lounge Pre-function & Collaboration Space		A 1,540 sq ft gathering space near the Rotary Conference Room and Business Center that is perfect for lounge, study, connecting with others, or book club meetings. A \$150,000 donation would name this space.
Pre-function Space for Walmart Room	 NAMED - Shelley & Doug McMillon	A high profile, 800 sq ft special space for entry into the Library from Main Street providing access to the new and larger Walmart Room, a small gallery and restrooms. This space has been named in honor of Shelley & Doug McMillon's generous \$100,000 donation.
Artist Row		Highly visible space that features rotating displays of regional artists, located in the library marketplace. A \$100,000 donation would name this space.

<b>Bike Hub</b>		<p>Directly connected to Main Street with access to downtown trails, the bike hub will serve as a place for bicyclists to stop off at BPL with access to bike racks and other amenities. \$100,000 would name this high profile outdoor area.</p>
<b>Business Center</b>		<p>A centralized 275 sq ft copy and print center with dedicated computers providing quick and easy access for patrons. This high-profile space would be named with a \$50,000 donation.</p>
<b>Book Drop Space</b>		<p>Glass walls will allow patrons to see the magic behind the scenes as BPL's automated system sorts returned materials to the proper location using (RFID). Located near the front entrance and community hub, it is a 264 sq ft high profile space that provides the library more room to expand its system. A \$50,000 donation would name this space.</p>
<b>Library Courtyard</b>		<p>The courtyard will provide a nice place to read a book or meet with others. Gardens will beautify the grounds around this courtyard that benefits time spent outdoors. A \$50,000 donation will name this lovely outdoor space.</p>
<b>Friends' Bookstore</b>	 <p style="text-align: center;">NAMED - Friends of the Bentonville Library</p>	<p>An expanded 900 sq ft bookstore for the Friends of the Library, with adjacent and dedicated storage for on-site stock. This special space is being named in honor of the Friends in recognition of their \$40,000 generous donation to the campaign.</p>
<b>8-seat Collaboration Rooms</b>	<p style="text-align: center;">1 NAMED - Howard &amp; Elaine Kerr</p>	<p>Two separate 200 sq ft rooms for adults to work collaboratively on projects with the ability to use for adult volunteer project work. Integrated technology is planned. One of the rooms has been named by Elaine &amp; Howard Kerr recognizing their generous \$30,000 donation.</p>
<b>Teen Zone Lounge</b>	 <p style="text-align: center;">NAMED - Tate Family</p>	<p>An open 530 sq ft seating space centrally located in the teen zone for students in grades 7<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> to enjoy connecting with others. Technology, games and other amenities are planned. This space has been named in honor of the Tate Family recognizing their generous support.</p>
<b>Wellness Room</b>	<p style="text-align: center;">HOLD</p>	<p>A space for nursing mothers to use or caregivers with small children to help them with a variety of developmental challenges involving communication, movement and social skills.</p>
<b>Adult Reading Lounge</b>	<p style="text-align: center;">NAMED - Hadi &amp; Greg Dudley</p>	<p>Dedicated seating for reading will be featured in the adult area near the Book Club Lounge. Windows flood the space with natural light.</p>
<b>Library Director Office</b>	<p style="text-align: center;">NAMED - Kathryn Jones</p>	<p>The administrative 150 sq ft office for the library director that is high profile, located in a main aisle. This space has been named by Kathryn Jones in recognition of her generous \$30,000 donation.</p>
<b>6-seat Collaboration Room</b>		<p>This 150 sq ft room for adults to study together or small teams to work collectively on projects with the ability to use for adult volunteer project work. A \$25,000 donation would name this space.</p>
<b>Teen 6-seat Group Study</b>	<p style="text-align: center;">NAMED - Judy &amp; Steve Marquess</p>	<p>This 150 sq ft room for high school students to study together or work collectively on projects with the ability to use for teen volunteer project work. This room has been named by Judy and Steve Marquess in recognition of their generous \$25,000 donation.</p>

Children's Group Study		Two separate 60 sq ft rooms for students in grades Kindergarten – 6 <sup>th</sup> to study together or receive tutoring. A \$15,000 donation would name a room.
Teen 4-seat Group Study		Three separate 100 sq ft rooms for a small group of teens to study together or work collectively on projects. Writable surface is planned. A \$15,000 donation would name a room.
Learning Gardens	 <p>NAMED - Bailey Family</p>	Community involvement in gardening allows people to experience plant care, encourages them to eat healthier, and nourishes a responsible, consistent, and positive attitude towards self-grown fruits, vegetables, and joy in beautiful flower gardens. A \$10,000 donation would name this area.
Librarian Office		There are 4 offices for our professional librarians that are high profile and visible to the public. Each office is 100 sq ft and could be named with a donation of \$10,000.
Foundation Office	NAMED - Best In Class Suppliers	The public-facing 125 sq ft office for the Bentonville Library Foundation. A \$10,000 donation would name this area.
Adult Volunteer Hub		An important 80 sq ft space for adults and junior partners to check-in to volunteer, receive work instructions and connect with BPL staff. A \$10,000 donation would name this space.
Individual Youth Study		Three separate 30 sq ft rooms for one or two children to study together or receive tutoring. Writable surface is planned. A donation of \$10,000 would name one of these spaces.
Youth Reading Nooks		Four separate and cozy reading nooks will be featured throughout out the youth services area. Bench seats as well as furnishings for caregivers to be nearby. A \$5,000 donation would name a nook.
Youth Tech - iPad Stations	 <p>1 NAMED - Diamond State Panels</p>	Technology touch points located in the main youth services area, near the study room corridor. <b>Two</b> separate sections to serve particular age levels. A \$5,000 donation would name one station.
